Item 1 - Declaration of Opening

Item 7 - Visitors and Presentations

7.1 NIDA ASGAR, DON, DOOMADGEE HOSPITAL – REPORT ON COVID

Nida advised and updated Council on positive COVID cases in the Community. Currently cases in the Community are isolating.

Troy (CEO) advised that if there are any positive results he needs to know immediately. There is a lot of false information floating around Doomadgee and Troy wants to kill it so needs to know the exact information. He needs the information before it goes on the stats. Troy will talk to Cam Pope and get back to Nida about him receiving the information ASAP.

Nida advised that lockdown at the hospital is not for children or hospital patients. She also advised that the first case was not even from a hotspot. It is spreading because people are not having any symptoms so they do not know to do anything about COVID.

The Government are sending out kits for the RAT Testing.

7.2 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER ROD CURTIN, FAMILY RESPONSIBILITY COMMMISSION (FRC)

In a document that was sent out in late November 2021 FRC advised that they had held:

503 Conferences – 83% by local commissioners, 63% by agreement 359 Community members have been case managed – Most have been by agreement with FRC to help the families and children.

In 2019 there were 81 referrals to service providers.

1920-1921 there were 94 referrals. The numbers are increasing. People are asking for income management.

Need to improve the level and capacity of service providers. FRC really wants to work with those services providers but need to make sure they are carrying out the services that they are paid to do. Want to increase the dealings with youth services for the kids. Need to get the kids off the streets.

Deputy Commissioner Rod advised that there are only two triggers in Doomadgee. Aurukun has five triggers.

At the moment any youth that are caught doing something wrong go to Court and get a caution – the FRC would like to work with the kids – helping them get a trade, returning to school, joining the army etc – something to give their life value.

Rod asked that if Council agreed with extending the triggers for Doomadgee that we send a letter to them to include:

Youth Justice; Housing; and Domestic Violence Orders and Breaches.

Troy raised certain matters with Bob Gee, Government Champion for Doomadgee and he advised that as long as we work with FRC on the ground things were OK. Bob also sits on the Family Responsibility Board.

Rod advised that the FRC want to do their job under their Act. They are not trying to erode Council's authority in any way at all.

The FRC started in Doomadgee in 2014. They are not agents for any Government Department. The FRC can work with clients so that kids are not removed from their houses, they can help improve their circumstances and Child Safety in not involved in these matters. FRC is funded by the Federal and State Governments as an Independent body. If Housing was one of Doomadgee's triggers FRC would be able to get involved with the clients and organise a repayment plan with housing which they cannot do at the moment.

Clients/Community members are going themselves to FRC and asking for help, and also voluntarily to the Serivce Providers which they were not doing earlier on.

Rod asked if Council was still happy for himself and Brenden Joinbee to come into Community to work. All Councillors said that they were very happy and wanted the work to continue.

When the kids are sent to Youth Justice and Correctional Services people there is a lot of red tape involved. FRC would like to be involved and engage with the kids in the Community and suggested that they would be able to carry out meaningful work.

Rod hopes to be back in Doomadgee around 8th February 2022.

Jason thanked Rod for all his support in getting rid of the Basic Card and supplying people with their credit cards.

Rod advised that Tammy Williams (the Commissioner of FRC) is desperate to come into Community and talk to everyone.

Rod thanked Council for their time and passed on his best wishes to all in the meeting together with their families.
