For a strong and sustainable future, Councils' operational plan is based on good planning and decision making to meet community needs and promote community wellbeing

Over the past 18 months we have delivered:

- ♦ 12 houses
- ♦ new workshop (Stage 1)
- ♦ new toilet block at the rodeo grounds,
- ♦ grading & sheeting of Old Doomadgee Road (50kms)
- ♦ kerb and sealing of town streets
- ♦ sealing of Roadhouse Carpark
- ♦ sealed a further 5kms Wolloogarang West Road,
- ♦ completed civil works for the Government Housing
- ♦ water and sewerage upgrade


LOVE WATER, DON'T WASTE IT!


